For over 10 years, the national office has operated in the Division of Epidemiology at the Columbia University Mailman School of Public Health in New York, NY, and is now the outreach arm of the Center For Injury Epidemiology And Prevention At Columbia University, a Center for Disease Control Injury Prevention Center.

### What is Forging New Frontiers?

Forging New Frontiers is one of the country's premier meetings surrounding the subject of childhood injury prevention.
