Lessons learned from these initiatives have both theoretical and practical significance, and can help to enhance future coalition efforts. The aims of this presentation are to: describe how an ecological model helps program planners identify multi-level factors and intervention techniques; provide examples of successful multi-level interventions that have modified injury related behaviors in populations; and introduce community and policy level techniques and concepts that can be used to enhance local safety promotion programs in the future.

She will focus on models for screening to identify children at risk of PTSD post-injury, and will present suggestions for parents and health care professionals to promote children’s resilience and prevent PTSD after injury.

This plenary session will examine the prevalence of bullying in the United States and explore intervention strategies that can contribute to the overall reduction of the interpersonal intentional injury burden in this country.

Dr. Flora Winston, Director, TRAUMALINK, Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia. Flora Winston shares details about this research collaboration among State Farm Insurance Companies, The Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia, and the University of Pennsylvania. The team goes beyond identification and in-depth study of crashes involving children to development and implementation of interventions and monitoring trends over time. The field of child occupant protection has experienced a recent infusion of new technology, laws and targeted educational campaigns fueled, in part, by PCPS research findings.
