WHEREAS, an estimated 54 percent of gun owners don't lock all of their guns securely and it is estimated that 4.6 million children live in a home with at least one unlocked and loaded gun; and

WHEREAS, almost every single day, a child gets their hands on a gun and unintentionally kills or injures themselves or someone else in the US; and

WHEREAS, research shows that the best way to protect children and teens from accessing guns is to implement secure firearm storage practices; and

WHEREAS, The Madison Common Council is on record supporting efforts to reduce gun violence; and

WHEREAS, hospitals, state agencies and community organizations are committed to their crucial role in reducing injuries and deaths by promoting safe practices; and

WHEREAS, National Injury Prevention Day raises awareness and promotes efforts to reduce injuries among children; the City of Madison commends Be SMART, a program developed by the Everytown for Gun Safety Support Fund and Moms Demand Action, and all involved in their endeavor to protect children from injury.
